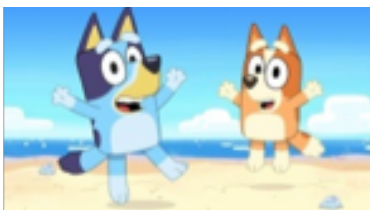

Grades 5-6

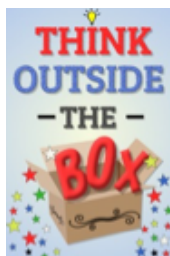
Join us the third Monday of each month from **4:00 – 5:00 p.m.** Each month we will read a different type of book and enjoy a fun activity! **Registration is required.**

Starting September 5 come into the Young Adults room and show us your creativity. We start the picture you finish it. Every finished picture will be entered into a drawing.

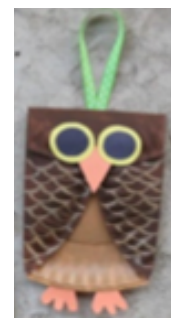


Craft Take and Make Kits
